Provide Concise, Actionable Recommendations Up Front

Clear, prioritized actions for immediate consideration by policymakers.



Explain the Approach

Landscape analysis, best practices review, collaborative discussion and recommendations



Establish Clear, Objective Definitions

Foundational definitions of AI and key concepts to guide initial policymaking.



Detail Risks, Benefits, and Topic-Specific Recommendations

Break down potential risks and benefits by focus area, with tailored recommendations.

#### Four Key Topic Areas for Al Policy and Governance



**Public Safety** 

Safeguards and protocols to protect residents from harmful or criminal uses of AI.



Government Use

Effective, responsible use of AI within state government operations to improve services and resident experience. Special focus on procurement.



**Education and Workforce** 

Developing an AI-ready workforce and integrating AI skills into Arkansas's education systems. Fostering local AI innovation and economic development.



Public Literacy, Trust, and Transparency

Building public understanding of AI, fostering trust, and ensuring transparent AI practices

- •Continuously align programs and resources to the evolving economy of this state (Act 936 of 2019)
- Make government information available subject to applicable security, privacy, compliance, governance, and confidentiality laws and best practices (Act 634 of 2023)
